## Calumet High School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

February 2, 2026

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Calumet High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our school was identified for: 'Has Not Been Given One of These Labels'.

A key challenge is increasing our math scores so that we can increase our proficiency rates on the PSAT and SAT.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Most students enroll in the high school directly from the middle school. We are the only traditional high school in the district. New students enrolling at Calumet High School are asked to register immediately. Those arriving in the summer should register as soon as possible to assure appropriate placement. Parents must present a state certified birth certificate, immunization verification and proof of residency upon enrollment.
2. The school improvement plan is developed by school and community members and is reviewed and communicated to the public annually. This plan serves as an overview and a compilation of our district plans. Based on our district strategic plan and on-going analysis of individual school and district data, the plan expresses the philosophy and fundamental goals of our entire organization. The district improvement plan is submitted to the Michigan Department of Education each year by June 30th.
3. We do not have any specialized schools within Calumet High School. We do have a specialized program with our Early College. By the beginning of a student’s junior year, he/she enrolls in our early college program by taking college level courses on our campus. This continues through their senior year. Students do not graduate at the end of their senior year, and instead enter into the “5<sup>th</sup> Year” of the program which places them on the campus of Gogebic Community College with fulltime status. At the end of the “5<sup>th</sup> Year” students earn their high school diploma and an associate’s degree or MEMCA Certification or other certification.
4. Our school follows the state approved curriculum for high school for all courses for which a state curriculum has been adopted. A listing of our course offerings and descriptions can be found on our web page in our student handbook.
5. Nationally Normed Achievement tests administered during the 2024-25 and 2023-24 school year were the PSAT and SAT. Below are some aggregate results.

7. FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, ONLY ALSO REPORT ON THE FOLLOWING:

- a. In 2024-25 SY 112 students or 30% of CHS students were dually enrolled in college courses. In 2023-24 SY 110 students or 27% of CHS students were dually enrolled in college courses. (These numbers do not include students in the "5<sup>th</sup> Year" of the Early College program.)
- b. Two AP/IB course was offered in 2024-25 SY which is the same number offered in the 2023-24 SY.
- c. 5 students were enrolled in an AP course in the 2024-25 SY. Nine students were enrolled in an AP course in 2023-24.

- d. 4 students received a score leading to college credit for the 2024-25 SY. Four students received a score leading to college credit for the 2023-24 SY.

We are extremely proud of the accomplishments of our students at Calumet High School. CHS students have more opportunities to excel than ever before. The students and staff are dedicated to an education that provides opportunities in and beyond high school.
