2020-2021 CLK Return to Learn COVID-19 Preparedness Plan AMENDMENT II

Amended: By School Board action on Tuesday, October 13, 2020

This amendment makes changes to the Phase 4 and Phase 5 Face Covering requirements of the CLK Return to Learn Preparedness Plan.

Face Coverings

- ~~● Face coverings will be required for JK-1 in all common areas and on the bus.~~
- ~~● Face coverings will be required for grades 2-12 at all times and on the bus.~~
- ~~● Face coverings will be required for all staff at all times.~~
- ~~● Face coverings will not be required for staff and students while eating, outside or when socially distanced.~~
- Face coverings must be worn by all staff and all students in grades JK-12 when in classrooms, hallways, common areas, and on a school bus.
- Staff and students may remove their facial coverings when:
 - Eating
 - Outdoor recess (grades JK-5)
 - Outdoors and consistently maintaining 6 feet of separation from others (all grades)
 - Exercising outdoors and consistently maintaining 6 feet of separation from others (all grades)
- Students unable to medically tolerate facial coverings may be exempt from the facial covering requirement by providing a signed waiver from their medical care provider.
- Acceptable facial coverings will now be defined as a scarf, bandana, gator/buff, or mask that covers both the nose and mouth, and is made of tightly woven fabric (ie: quilting material, cotton sheet or shirt material), or a disposable level-one (basic) grade surgical mask in its original state. Facial coverings made of thin, see through materials such as mesh fabric are not deemed appropriate for use during the school day.

The Board of Education will review the plan in September and on a monthly basis for the duration of the school year.
